POWER IN NUMBERS: WHY BE A UUP UNION MEMBER

NYS and SUNY have numerous tools in their vast arsenal of weapons that they can wield to accomplish their purpose, which, sad to say, is usually to get reelected and/or self-aggrandizement. Few are the people at such high levels of leadership who really care for little else, other, say their personal agenda. Historically we find that political leaders will sacrifice anyone and everyone for their own cause. We, part of the arm of public labor, are not high on the Governor's list of important people. Just check out the way he threatened and cajoled the other unions when they attempted to negotiate new contracts.

The policies of those high up the ladder also supersedes even those who administer at the local level, and it does not bode well for SUNY campuses across the state. SUNY's Shared-Services Alliances are potentially destructive to the very infrastructure of the state college system. Already at least four colleges are being combined into two, with one campus president directing two colleges. Besides the administrative alterations, what I see for SUNY is possibly the eventual elimination of similar programs on different campuses, online courses substituting for in-class instruction.

So, why become a UUP Union member? The only tool we little people have at our disposal is our numbers. Collectively we have power, (*One of the reasons the Wisconsin governor pressed so diligently for the removal of collective bargaining from state's unions*). Elected officials look at numbers. When we show a united front by signing up as UUP members, not just fee payers, we present numbers that those officials cannot ignore. At this critical juncture in SUNY history, if we wish to see New York State's Higher Ed remain focused on its intended purpose of providing the best education for our youth, we must remain united.

For those of you who may still be fee payers, please help us out at this time. Take a moment to sign up to become an active UUP member. There is no extra cost to you, and what you might help accomplish... well, I believe you see the possibilities.

DSI DISTRIBUTION

Some of our members have been wondering about this year's DSI distribution. The following information should assist in providing clarification.

The 1% DSI monies in the past have been offered by the state at the end of UUP contract negotiations, and not been part of the negotiations themselves. Although the 1% was to be given to the UUP members the state handed it over to SUNY campus administrators to distribute in a manner of their choosing, each campus administration opting for the method to be used. UUP did not decide how this will be done.

The Alfred UUP Chapter has made several requests to Administration for an across the board distribution of DSI this year, seeing this may be the last pay increase our members will receive for some time. Administration has chosen to follow its previous method of merit style distribution, which it has the authority to do.

Choosing to participate in requesting DSI for this year in an individual choice, UUP remaining non-committal as to the way it is being done. No matter the way DSI is distributed, the entire 1% of the funds must go to UUP members.



CONTINUING OR PERMANENT APPOINTMENT

We recommend that any employees who have completed seven years of full time service or more, and who have not received a letter of continuing or permanent appointment from the chancellor, contact the union office for more information.

WELCOME JOE PETRICK PART TIME CONCERNS

The Part-time Concerns Representative to a UUP local chapter monitors the concerns of those UUP represented employees who are part-time employees, on both the academic and professional staff. Although I am a full-time librarian, (and thus not a part-time employee), I empathize with the concerns of contingent employees, and will address those concerns, and, as prescribed by the local UUP Bylaws, report them to the local Executive Committee and the Chapter President.

I have been employed by Alfred State College for eleven years, and for the past six years have been the Alfred State College representative to University Faculty Senate. Although the University Faculty Senator is not responsible for any contact with contingent employees, I have over the years seen a number of situations directly relating to them that has sensitized me to the conditions in which part-time work takes place. Most recently, I attended the UUP committee retreat for Part-Time Concerns officers, and engaged in discussion with part-time faculty and staff from across UUP-represented SUNY campuses.

Although UUP cannot change contractual conditions of employment, there are benefits that the union has negotiated available to part-time UUP employees, depending on the amount of employment at the College. Some of these benefits may include:

1) Eligibility for full coverage in the New York State Health Insurance Program (NYSHIP), if the employee

teaches two or more classes, or, if a professional employee, earns \$13,870 over a calendar year beginning in July.

2) Those employees qualifying for NYSHIP also qualify for the UUP Benefit Trust Fund, which includes dental and vision benefits, as well as the UUP Scholarship for eligible dependent children attending SUNY state-operated colleges.

3) Part-time employees are also eligible for professional development opportunities. They may for example enroll in one course per semester on a "space available" basis at a SUNY campus whose employees are represented by UUP. Professional development grants are also available for part-time employees through the Joint Management funded committee. Fifteen percent of the funds must be made available to part-time employees.

4) Contingent employees are eligible for pension plans.
