CHAPTER ACTIVISTS ADVOCATE FOR DOWNSTATE MARCH 6, 2022 - UUP/PSC RALLY



Downstate Chapter members Redetha Abrahams-Nichols and Samuel Marquez advocated for funding for Downstate at a huge March 6 event that closed half the Brooklyn Bridge in a show of solidarity for Funding public higher education - SUNY and CUNY.

UUP members joined Legislators and more than 1,000 SUNY/CUNY students and members of the Professional Staff Congress/CUNY in Brooklyn for the first of two rallies that day. Redetha Abraham-Nichols and UUP President Fred Kowal spoke at that rally, in front of historic Brooklyn Borough Hall.

Chapter Vice President for Academics Samuel Marquez spoke at the second rally, held at Foley Square in Manhattan, minutes after a boisterous crowd of signwaving students and union members walked across the Manhattan-bound side of the 1.1-mile-long Brooklyn Bridge. Downstate Chapter President Rowena Blackman-Stroud, Vice President for **Professionals** Hazel Shirlev Officer Williams. Retirees Patterson, Grievance Chair Chantel D. Fuller and members of the Downstate Chapter were also at the event.



In her speech, Redetha Abrahams-Nichols who worked as a Nurse Manager in the Emergency Department during the epicenter of the pandemic advocated for hazard pay for in person service during the pandemic. She said that SUNY Downstate Health Sciences University—has not received state support in years, even as our members risked their lives to take care of seriously ill patients at the time where there was no cure or vaccine for COVID-19.

"The COVID-only designation placed on Downstate amounted to an unfunded mandate," she said. "Our hospital was forced to suspend any revenuegenerating procedures to focus solely on COVID patients. Since then, Downstate has received no financial help from the state to make up for those losses.

Because Downstate was a COVID-only hospital, patients were slow to return to us for care. They did not want to come to Downstate because they were afraid they would come down with COVID. I hope our political leaders have not forgotten what we have been through. So, I ask today: please remember the sacrifices that we have made and restore the 150-million-dollar subsidy to SUNY Teaching Hospitals and an additional appropriation for SUNY Downstate for its unfunded COVID-19 mandate.




Samuel Marquez, Vice President for Academics and a member of UUP's statewide Executive Board, talked about the importance of Downstate as a prime pipeline of doctors and medical professionals—many of them people of color—to New York City hospitals and health care facilities.

"The SUNY teaching hospitals, and SUNY Downstate, where I'm from, specifically produces more doctors of color than any institution in this state," he continued. "SUNY public teaching hospitals will create healthier communities. We are a public teaching hospital and incredibly we get no direct state support. This must change."

Samuel Marquez also pressed for additional state funds for SUNY in the final enacted state budget.

- Hazard pay for all employees who provided in person service during the pandemic

I am also asking that all appropriate staff titles be included in the hazard/retention bonuses proposed for healthcare workers. All heroes must be recognized for their service so the salary cap should be removed. SUNY Downstate was declared a COVID-only hospital at

the height of the pandemic and has faced years of austerity. Please, be a public healthcare champion and fully fund our SUNY hospitals to help us recover!
