We are pleased to invite you to our upcoming chapter meeting on Thursday, February 27, 2025, where we will be discussing critical issues affecting our institution and the broader academic community. This is a crucial meeting, and we encourage all members to attend to stay informed and engaged.



#### Special Guest: UUP Statewide President Fred Kowal

We are honored to welcome UUP Statewide President Fred Kowal, who will be joining us to discuss the proposed cuts in NIH funding of indirect costs and the significant impacts these reductions could have on research institutions like Stony Brook University.

As many of you know, the NIH provides crucial funding for research, and indirect costs—also known as facilities and administrative (F&A) costs—support essential infrastructure, including laboratory maintenance, administrative support, and compliance with federal regulations. The proposed reductions threaten the ability of institutions to sustain high-quality research programs, potentially leading to:

Reduced research funding for faculty and investigators

- Limitations in hiring research staff and postdoctoral scholars
- Challenges in maintaining research facilities and equipment
- Increased financial strain on universities to cover essential administrative services

President Kowal will provide insight into how these cuts may affect Stony Brook University specifically and how they fit into the broader national landscape of research funding. He will also outline UUP's response and advocacy efforts to push back against these harmful reductions.

#### **UUP's Response and Advocacy Efforts**

In light of these proposed cuts, UUP has been actively working to protect research funding and ensure that institutions like Stony Brook receive the necessary financial support to sustain their research missions. During the meeting, we will discuss:

- UUP's engagement with state and federal policymakers to oppose these funding reductions
- Upcoming advocacy initiatives, including calls to action for faculty and staff
- Strategies for mobilizing the academic and research community to highlight the critical importance of indirect cost funding

Your participation in these efforts is essential. We encourage all members to stay informed, get involved, and advocate for policies that support higher education and research.

#### Presentation of the 2025/2026 Chapter Budget

In addition to discussing the NIH funding issue, we will also be presenting the UUP Stony Brook Health Sciences Chapter budget for the 2025/2026 fiscal year. This is an opportunity for members to review and provide input on the financial planning and allocation of resources within our chapter. The budget presentation will cover:



### IDA grant portal is open

The application portal for the individual development award grants (IDA) is open for the second and final round for the 24/25 contract year. This round is to encompass projects undertaken from 1/1/25 through 7/1/25. The portal will be open through 3/31/25. There is a \$2000 limit per member for projects completed in any contract year. If you received an award in the first round, that closed 12/31/24 any award granted in that round will be deducted from any award in the current round. If you received \$2000 in the first round, you are ineligible for an award this round. If you submitted an application in Round 1 that was approved you are only eligible to seek reimbursement for one project in round 2. If not, you can submit applications for up to 2 projects. The contract allows for up to 2 projects per year. If submitting for more than one project you must complete a separate application for each.

All applications must be completed online and not handwritten. Handwritten applications will be rejected. all documents must be submitted online and uploaded with the outlined naming convention.
