

# Watermelon White Wine Spritzer

## Ingredients:

- 2 cups watermelon, cubed
- 1 tbsp agave nectar
- 2 cups white wine
- 2 cups club soda
- Garnish: watermelon wedge



Add the watermelon and agave nectar into a food processor or blender, and pulse until smooth. If desired, pour through a cheesecloth to strain.

Divide the mixture among 4 rocks glasses.

Top with equal parts white wine and club soda (about 1/2 cup each).

Garnish with a watermelon wedge.

Our voice is heard as the main advocate for SUNY campus and hospital funding, and for other legislative issues of importance to you—issues that help us better meet the needs of our students and our patients.

Being a member of UUP also means you maintain:

- Representation in interrogations or disciplinary actions, or in legal actions brought on behalf of members;
- Representation if Title IX harassment complaints are filed against you (for student or co-worker complaints);
- Access to benefits and services provided by UUP Member Services Trust, and discount programs and services provided by UUP's state and national affiliates: NYSUT, AFT and NEA;
- Access to UUP's vision, dental, and life insurance plans in retirement; and
- The right to vote on the union contract, and to provide input in chapter and statewide union elections.

# CENSUS 2020 EVERYONE COUNTS



**Everyone counts:** The census counts every person living in the United States, including non-citizens and children.

**It's in the U.S. Constitution:** Since 1790, the census has occurred every 10 years.

**Take part in democracy:** Completing the census is part of your civic duty.

## **Fair representation and redistricting:**

The information collected during the census determines how many Congressional seats each state gets. States also use the data to redraw the boundaries for federal and state legislative districts.



**\$675 billion:** The census data determines where to send over \$675 billion in federal funds, grants, and support to states, counties and communities. *That's vital funding for SUNY and our public teaching hospitals.*

**Complete your census form online:** For the first time, people will be able to fill out their census questionnaire online, by phone, or by mail. You will receive an invitation to respond in March, with reminders in the following weeks.



**Privacy:** It's against the law for the Census Bureau to share your information publicly or with any other government agency. The information you share cannot be used against you.
